

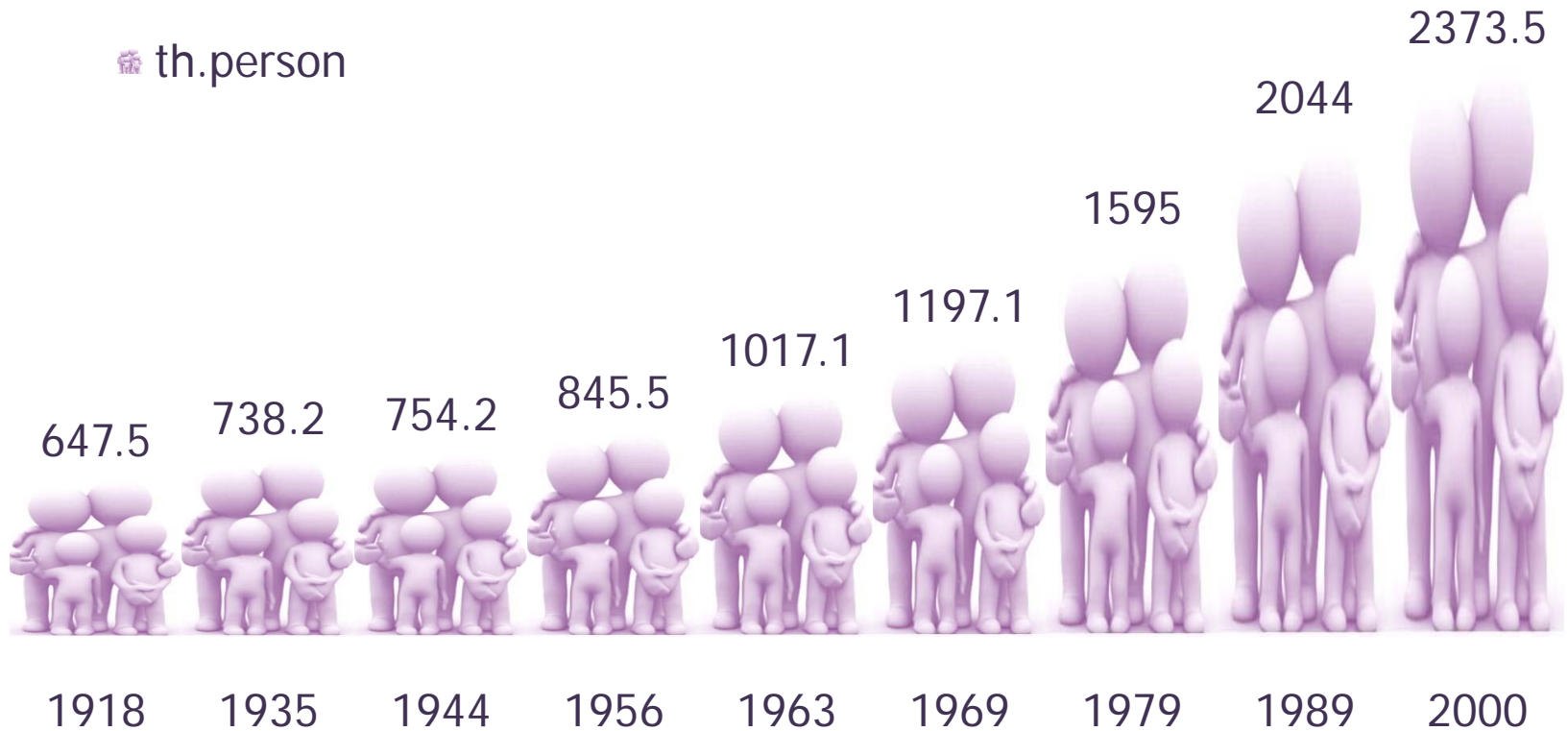

Censuses in Mongolia



Lessons learned from the 2000 population census

- Limitations in legislative regulations
- Problem in comparability of census data
- Budget constraints
- Lack of qualified trainers
- Insufficient use of EA maps

The main features of 2010 census

- The first census to implement the new census law
- Master plan will be prepared for the first time according to common international standards
- The first census to be undertaken in the 21st century, collecting socio-economic and demographic data for the use in formulation of Governments policies and programs and monitor implementation status

Legal environments for the census Laws

- Chapter 7, Article 1a of Law on Statistics of Mongolia:
 - The National Statistical Office shall conduct nationwide Population and Housing Censuses in every 10 years, and inter-censual surveys in every 5 years between the censuses.
- Law on Population and Housing Census of Mongolia
 - Approved on 3 January 2008 by the Parliament of Mongolia
 - Consists of 6 chapters and 20 articles

Legal environments for the census

Parliament resolutions

- Parliament resolution No.18 of February 6, 2008
 - Census reference time - 00:00 hours of 10 January 2010
 - Enumeration period - one week between 10-16 January 2010
- Parliament resolution No.19 of February 6, 2008
 - Established the **State Census Committee** chaired by the Prime Minister of Mongolia.
- Parliament resolution No.88 of December 9, 2009
 - Census reference time - 00:00 hours of 11 November 2010
 - Enumeration period - one week between 11-17 November 2010

1. Developed the Law on Population and Housing Census of Mongolia.
2. Organized the first meeting of the State Census Committee.
3. Established the Population and Housing Census Bureau at the NSO.
 - Professional unit responsible of census
 - Permanent operating

Activities within the census preparations

4. **Master plan** for the census has been developed for the first time.

5. Organized **Donors' Meeting** for the 2010 Population and Housing Census.

6. Full scale Pilot Census was carried out in selected 6 administrative units of both urban and rural areas, covering approximately 1 percent of the total population.

2009.01-04

7. Organized the second meeting of the State Census Committee.

2009.05

- Established Census committees at all aimags and the capital city and relevant ministries.
- Approved the term of reference for Census Committees.

Activities within the census preparations

8. Organized a workshop for Aimag and the Capital City governors and heads of the statistical divisions.

2009.06-2010.06

- Discussed about the census preparatory work and further preparations.

9. Developing digital mapping database for census planning and results dissemination is in progress.

2009-2010

- Permission to utilize digital maps for the census has been obtained from the Central Intelligence Agency.

10. Developed census questionnaire and summary forms.

- Approved by NSO Chairman's Order No. 01/135 of 2009.

11. Finalized Census guidelines and manuals.

- Manual of utilizing maps for the census;

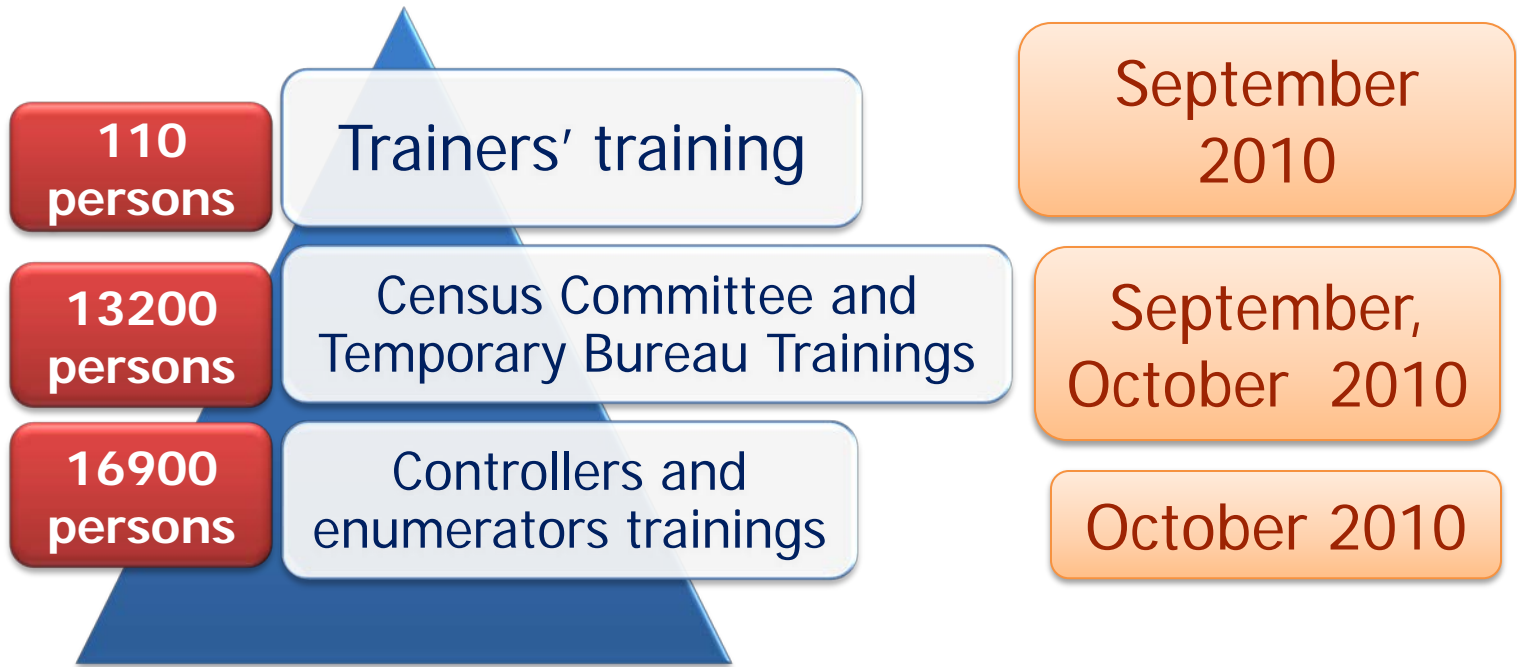

 - ❑ In rural areas - 1:100000 scale topographic maps;
 - ❑ In urban areas – cadastre maps;
- Methodology
 - ❑ Use ArcGIS 9.3 software (to be purchased)
 - ❑ Develop digital mapping database;
 - ❑ Produce census mappings and disseminate;
- ❑ Mappings to be used at bagh and khoroo level belong to state secrets.

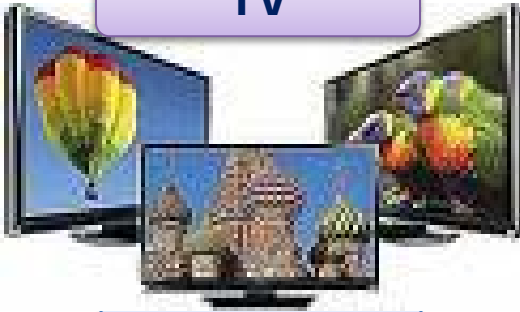
