NETWORK ANALYSIS OF SDGs & THEIR TARGETS

- The SDGs cover much broader range of issues and are universal, i.e. addressed by all countries ranging from LDCs to Highly Industrialized Countries
- The integration across sectors in terms of strategies, policies and implementation is another important characteristic of the SDGs
- In this context, the proposed goals and targets can be regarded as a network whereby some targets may link with multiple SDGs.
- As it is described in UN DESA (2015), targets which are linked to multiple goals and sectors facilitate integration and policy coherence across sectors.
- UN DESA background paper uses Social Network Analysis (SNA) approach to link targets to their specific goals as well as other SDGs. In this setup, targets are included from their own SDG or from other SDGs and these inter-linkages establish the structure of the network of targets.



NETWORK ANALYSIS OF SDGs & THEIR TARGETS

- In this regard, the proposed table is a 107-by-16 matrix and SDGs are represented in columns.
- In the column entries, <u>contributing factors</u> to each SDG from all targets are given. It
 has to be stated that these targets include both core and non-core, i.e. targets
 from other SDGs
- In the row entries, <u>each target's contribution</u> to its corresponding SDG is given.
- Establishing such a matrix would enable us to see the network relationship among SDGs and targets either one way or two-ways which is highly strategic for the coordination and collaboration for the work of SDGs.
- Furthermore, it will also be possible to link them with the relevant statistical indicators. This is especially critical for an effective feedback mechanism in this work.



NETWORK ANALYSIS OF SDGs & THEIR TARGETS

- It has to be emphasized that this figure is constructed in the context of the universal constraints rather than any regional and/or national contexts. Therefore, there may have <u>some amendments</u> in this network analysis of the SDGs <u>with regard to the regional and/or national priorities</u>.
- Last but not the least, the SDGs need to achieve an appropriate balance between the economic, social and environment dimensions of sustainable development.
- The SDGs 1-5, 10-11 and 16 and their targets are mainly focused on social objectives,
- The SDGs 6-7 and 12-15 and their targets are primarily focused on environmental objectives,
- The SDGs 8-9 and their targets are specifically concentrated on economic objectives of sustainable development.
