Country progress in meeting the 2030 Agenda statistics requirements

SDG indicators global database

<u>Platform</u> providing access to data compiled through UN System

- Global database
 - By SDG indicator
 - By country or area
 - Including all countries present here
- Metadata repository

National vs. global data

Discrepancies between national and global data have been a consistent concern throughout the MDG era:

- National statistical systems provide data to international agencies, which may then adjust them to ensure comparability across countries
- Countries sometimes have recent data that haven't yet been added to the global database
- If NSS doesn't generate relevant data, the responsible custodian agency may fill the gap by using data collected through surveys sponsored or carried out by international agencies
- Custodian agencies continuously extend their sources of data and refine their methods
 - In some cases revising data for earlier years as better data becomes available → better quality data, but different database vintages not comparable over time



Solutions

- **Strengthened capacity** of NSSs to produce official statistics in line with internationally established methodology and standards
- Adjustments / estimates of country data be undertaken in full consultation with countries and through fully transparent mechanisms
 - As recommended by UNSC48 (see session 1 slides)



Metadata repository

- Maintained by the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD)
- Work-in-progress
- Has, at the moment, metadata for:
 - 76 Tier 1 indicators (91.6% of tier total)
 - 48 Tier 2 indicators (81.3%)
 - 8 Tier 3 indicators (9.6%)
 - 4 multi-tier indicators (80%)
