

TNSO has been assigned to prepare the Statistical Master Plan for an implementation of the government statistical work

This responsibility will encourage the country:

- To have comprehensive official statistics


- To promote and support all government agencies to be able to produce statistical data in accordance with standardized quality

Thailand Statistical Master Plans (TSMP)




"Thailand's statistics represent a joint effort of all government agencies that are driven by a shared goal to develop Official Statistics to guide and support national development"


1st TSMP (2011-2015)



Challenges of GOS

of data

Violence Against Women
Some indicators are discontinued
Some indicators are not sex-disaggregared data
Lack of quality of data assessment and insurance

Insufficient knowledges and experiences in data and statistics
