- 6. Multi-dimensional poverty survey
- 7. Food Insecurity Experience Scale (FIES) Survey
- 8. Quality of education survey for children and youth
- 9. Adult education skills assessment survey
- 10. Time use survey
- 11. Agriculture household survey including the land rights
- 12. Financial Inclusion Survey
- 13. Survey on access to health services including immunization



### Sample Surveys-HIES/LSMS

- \* 1.1.1 Proportion of population below the international poverty line, by **sex**, age, employment status and geographical location (urban/rural) ( PPP from ICP)
- \* 1.2.1 Proportion of population living below the national poverty line, by **sex** and age ( along with National Poverty Line)
- \* 10.2.1 Proportion of people living below 50 per cent of median income, by age, sex and persons with disabilities

### DHS/MICS

- 2.2.1 Prevalence of stunting (height for age <-2 standard deviation from the median of the World Health Organization (WHO) Child Growth Standards) among children under 5 years of age
- \* 2.2.2 Prevalence of malnutrition (weight for height >+2 or <-2 standard deviation from the median of the WHO Child Growth Standards) among children under 5 years of age, by type (wasting and overweight)</p>
- 3.1.2 Proportion of births attended by skilled health personnel (additionally RHS)
- \* 3.7.1 Proportion of women of reproductive age (aged 15–49 years) who have their need for family planning satisfied with modern methods (additionally from contraceptives prevalence survey/ Fertility and Family surveys/ Reproductive health surveys)

  - (disaggregate by sex)
- \* 8.7.1 Proportion and number of children aged 5–17 years engaged in child labour, by **sex** and age (household based labour force surveys)
- 16.2.1 Proportion of children aged 1–17 years who experienced any physical punishment and/or psychological aggression by caregivers in the past month
  - additionally through other sample surveys/components: detected and undetected. Detected- law enforcement agencies. Undetected- UNODC Methodology
  - Disaggregate by sex
- 16.2.3 Proportion of young women and men aged 18–29 years who experienced sexual violence by age 18

5.2.2 Proportion of women and girls aged 15 years and older subjected to sexual violence by persons other than an intimate partner in the previous 12 months, by age and place of occurrence	Sample Survey-Special survey to collect data on violence from non-intimate partners or DHS ( Don't use administrative data)

### Strategy to address the Gap

- \* Assess the availability of Statistical business processes
- \* Periodicity and quality
- \* Extent to which the information is being collected
- \* Review the items of information which can be included
- Include the new Statistical business processes in your NSDS
- \* Develop a phased programme to get the information collected on regular basis
