Definition

- No where is there a single agency responsible to collect all official statistics of a nation. Rather *statistical systems* exist *on a continuum*.

Single agency produces most

Definition



A National statistical System (NSS) include:

 Producers: All agencies that collect, process, and disseminate data that can be used for public policy formulation

 Users: Governments, politicians and legislators, Markets, members of public, the Media, International community



Definition



- A National statistical service is *centralized* if the *management* and *operations* of the statistical program are predominantly the responsibility of a *single* autonomous gov. agency, headed by *chief Statistician*.
- It can include <u>outposting of staff</u> ... or delegation of certain tasks to geographically <u>separate units</u>, which remain <u>subordinate</u> to the central authority
