Scope and Outcome of Global Strategy

- Developed in order to address a weakness in basic data and availability of information
- Outcome is to enable target countries to build sustainable systems to produce accurate and reliable data to inform and guide policy analysis and decision making
- Three pillars
 - Establish a minimum set of core data required to meet current and emerging demands
 - Integrate agriculture into the national statistical system to improve comparability across economic, social and environmental domains
 - Foster the sustainability of agricultural statistical systems through governance and statistical capacity building



Scope and Outcome of Global Strategy, ctd

- Four Global Outputs (to which regions contribute)
 - Effective governing bodies set up and functioning at global and regional levels
 - Coordinating bodies of the national statistical system, legal frameworks and strategic plans established in target countries, to enable the integration of agriculture into national statistical systems
 - New cost effective methods for data collection, analysis and dissemination developed and disseminated
 - Increased capacity of agricultural statistics staff in regional training centres and target countries



Regional Component

- Regional office
 - Located in Bangkok office of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)
 - Responsible for
 - Planning and coordination issues
 - Support to the Regional Steering Committee
 - Technical assistance to countries
- Statistical Institute for Asia and the Pacific (SIAP)
 - Responsible for training component
- Asian Development Bank
 - Undertaking research activities using own funds



Regional Office Activities

- Regional Office has been established
- Regional Action Plan (RAP) has been finalised and approved, including overall budget
- Regional Steering Committee (RSC) has been established
 - Ultimate decision making body at regional level
 - Made up of eight country members and members representing donors, implementing partners and research and training institutions
 - Two meetings during 2013 with main outcomes to
 - Approve work plans and budgets
 - Select countries for inclusion in the RAP process



Regional Office Activities, ctd

- Coordination and collaboration
 - Among implementing partners
 - With other regional organisations and donors
 - Country level implementation
- Reporting
 - Governance arrangements require reporting at both regional and global level of workplans, budgets, activity reports and financial statements



Regional Office Activities, ctd

- Communication, advocacy
 - Aimed at increasing the promotion and visibility of the Global Strategy at regional level and support Resource Mobilization efforts
- Monitoring and Evaluation
 - A detailed regional M&E framework is being developed, consistent with the Global M&E framework



Technical Assistance Activities

- In-depth Country Assessment (IdCA) Guidelines and Reports
 - IdCA is starting point for work in each country
 - Provides a comprehensive assessment of current statistical capacity and areas of weakness
- Country Proposal document
 - List of projects required in the short-medium term to improve agricultural and rural statistics
 - Each project description includes objectives, outcomes, activities, timeframe and costs
 - Global Strategy will fund some of these projects, starting in 2014



Technical Assistance Activities, ctd

- Strategic Plan for Agricultural and Rural Statistics (SPARS)
 - Long-term (10 year) strategy document
 - Intended to be compatible with, and integrate into, a country's National Strategy for Development of Statistics (NSDS)
- Following slides provide information about progress in each country



Bangladesh

- Funded by Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation
- IdCA has been prepared and validated
- Country Proposal document is being prepared
- Main focus of Country Proposal will be preparation of a SPARS, including
 - \odot Improving coordination and institutional relationships
 - Establishment of an integrated plan of surveys and related calendar
 - Preparation of a strategy paper, and
 - Preparation of the SPARS



Bhutan

- IdCA has been endorsed by government
- Country Proposal document is being prepared
- Main projects in the Country Proposal will include
 - Development of a SPARS
 - Improvements to annual crop statistics through improved survey design and a range of training for relevant staff
 - Improvements to annual livestock data through improvements to the frame and revised questionnaire design
 - A range of improvements to institutional and HR capacity of line agencies
 - Production of updated and revised Land Cover Maps
 - Support to the development of the next Census of Renewable Natural Resources
 - Support to the development of the next Bhutan Living Standards Survey



Indonesia

- IdCA has been endorsed by key stakeholders and is awaiting government endorsement
- Country Proposal document is being prepared
- Main projects in the Country Proposal will include
 - Improvements to the quality of annual crop area and production estimates
 - Move to a scientific sample survey approach
 - Provide appropriate training and resources to enumerators
 - Improvements to fisheries statistics
 - Improvements to forestry statistics
 - Development of a SPARS

Global Strategy to Improve Agricultural and Rural Statistics – Asia Pacific

Samoa

- IdCA has been prepared and is awaiting endorsement by government
- Country Proposal document is being prepared
- Main focus of the Country Proposal is the lack of availability of regular estimates of agriculture production. Key areas include
 - Re-introduction of an Agricultural Survey every ten years (which would enable an Agricultural Survey / Census every 5 years), including
 - Project planning
 - Questionnaire development
 - Sample design
 - Development of an agriculture 'module' to be included in other national surveys as appropriate
 - Evaluation of an agriculture module tool
 - Development of the questionnaire
 - Improved capacity of staff in relevant ministries
 - Detailed capacity needs assessment
 - Subsequent training to address needs



Sri Lanka

- IdCA has been prepared and is awaiting endorsement by government
- Country Proposal document is being prepared
- Main projects in the Country Proposal will include
 - Assessing data needs for National Accounts
 - Improving rice crop cutting surveys
 - Improving crop forecasting
 - Processing and dissemination of Agriculture Census data
 - Improving production estimates of selected highland crops
 - Improving Cost of Production statistics for Fisheries
 - Improving Cost of Production statistics for Rice
 - Improving data quality in Food Balance Sheets
 - Improving Livestock production statistics

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Fiji and Lao PDR

- An initial mission has been completed in each country
- First draft of IdCA is currently being prepared
