



Remote learning component of the Training of Trainers on Telephone Surveys |25-28 January 2021|

Whilst social-distance measures remains in place due to spread of COVID-19, many national survey organisations are beginning to conduct telephone interviews, rather than in-person interviews.

This course which was jointly organised by the Institute and the Development Data Group of the World Bank consisted of a video learning component between 12 and 22 January 2021, followed by a remote learning component.

Throughout the remote learning component, participants were allocated in breakout rooms to discuss issues and, exchange their views and experiences with their peers.



E-learning course on compiling climate change indicators: an account approach |6 January – 12 February 2021|

Climate change is one of the most pressing issues of our time. A better understanding of the relationship between the economy and climate change through the compilation of relevant indicators is key to mitigating and adapting to climate change. Three webinar sessions were also held throughout the course which focused on climate change indicators that can be compiled from environmental economic accounts.



E-learning course on principles of data visualisation for official statistics |13 January-24 February 2021|


This course introduces data visualization as a tool to produce high-quality graphics for monitoring official statistics and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) indicators. It also provides an opportunity for participants to explore and comprehend the techniques of data visualization for exploration as well as for dissemination and also, proposes strategies for visualizing in multi-dimensions as well as practical methods for representing statistical indicators on maps or with dashboards.



E-learning course on disaster related statistics framework |22 February – 9 April 2021|

At the national and sub-national levels timely and accurate disaster related statistics are needed to support countries in all phase of the disaster risk management cycle from risk assessment to recovery. This course aims to build national capacities for the compilation of disaster related statistics for enhancing disaster management and promote the risk-informed sustainable development in the countries.
