Webinar series on the 2025 System of National Accounts (2025 SNA) Implementation

3 June - 22 July 2025

I. Background

The 2025 System of National Accounts (2025 SNA) was adopted by the United Nations Statistical Commission during the 56th session in March 2025. The 2025 SNA is integrated with the 7th edition of the Integrated Balance of Payments and International Investment Position Manual (BPM). Varying capacities and experiences of national statistical offices in implementing the 2008 SNA will have an impact on the smooth transition to the updated framework. The implementation challenges are accentuated especially in small island developing states and most developing countries where data collection is not frequent nor granular for the new standard breakdown and/or supplementary tables/accounts, due to an array of factors such as resource constraints amongst others.

Past [SNA outreach activities](#) presented the key concepts, definitions, and recommendations of the SNA manual and guidance notes. During the [introductory webinar](#) co-organized by the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) Statistics Division, Statistical Institute for Asia and the Pacific, and the Pacific Community (SPC) in March 2025, participants raised the need to share country priorities and practices in implementing the SNA. Country-specific technical concerns and issues, however, would require in-depth training and technical assistance to ensure effective skills transfer. It is also imperative that national strategies for statistical development include the 2025 SNA.

II. Objectives

The [strategy for implementing the 2025 SNA and BPM7](#) emphasizes the significance of regional organizations in supporting with the implementation. It also highlights the importance of opportunities at the regional level for countries to share implementation plans and identify support that can be provided at this level.

The webinar series targets statisticians with knowledge and experience in the collection, compilation, and dissemination of national accounts statistics. Specifically, it will serve as a regional platform for knowledge exchange across Asia and the Pacific:

- Enabling national statistical organizations to share their approaches to transitioning to the 2025 SNA, particularly
 - o SNA implementation strategy/plan to be undertaken
 - o Compilation issues encountered
 - o Data sources used
 - o Conceptual, methodological, and practical changes adopted

- Preliminary estimates, if any
- Communication strategy to be employed
- Providing a venue for the international community to outline how it will support the SNA implementation in Asia and the Pacific

III. Expected Outcomes

By the end of the webinar series, participants are able to:

- Identify initiatives of national statistical organizations in updating their methodological frameworks consistent with the 2025 SNA
- Analyze their own compilation challenges and assess the appropriate practical approach to address them
- Identify priority activities to fully implement the 2008 SNA and/or transition to the 2025 SNA for consideration in the national strategy for the development of statistics
- Familiarize themselves with initiatives of the international community to support the SNA implementation in Asia and the Pacific.

IV. Structure and dates of the webinar

The webinars will be organized every Tuesday between June 3 and July 22. The sessions will be conducted in English without interpretation. For SNA-related topics, each resource person will be allotted 25 minutes for the presentation, followed by an open forum. For implementation strategies, resource persons are given 5 to 15 minutes to discuss their initiatives within the country and international support. The open forum will follow after the presentations have been completed.
