Main indicators of the informal economy

- Informal sector units (as a % of all economic units)
- Workers in the informal economy (as a % of all workers)
 - For men and women separately
 - For the various age groups
 - For the various types of workplace
 - And other characteristics

The indicators may cover ...

- Only persons in employment, also workers who produce goods for own final use, or all workers
- Only non-agriculture
- Only the main job



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More detail for workers in the informal economy

- Classified by components
 - Workers engaged in informal sector units (as a % of all workers)
 - Informal workers engaged in formal sector units (as a % of all workers)
 - Informal workers engaged in households (as a % of all workers)
- Classified by status in employment
 - Informal entrepreneurs
 - Paid employees
 - Paid employees in the informal sector
 - Paid employees in the formal sector
 - Paid employees in households (domestic employees)
 - Contributing family workers
 - · CFW in the informal sector
 - CFW in the formal sector
 - Other unpaid workers
 - Other unpaid workers in the informal sector
 - · Other unpaid workers in the formal sector
 - Own use producers exclusively for own final use
 - Other unpaid workers in households



Main indicator on the informal economy


Workers in the informal economy as a percentage of all workers

- By components (workers in informal units, other informal workers)
- By sex, age and place of work


Workers in the informal economy as a % of all workers, selected Asian countries





By components it is more informative





Metadata

- Methodological and quality information of the statistics
 - Methodological metadata are needed ...
 - To facilitate sharing, querying, interpreting and understanding the data
 - · To facilitate the processing of data
 - To harmonize national statistics to prepare regional/global estimates
 - Quality of data metadata are needed ...
 - To evaluate the validity of statistics as a representation of the reality
- Particularly important for informality because
 - The field is relatively new
 - There are differences in national definitions and in time



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Metadata (cont'd)

- Metadata need to be provided in a consistent manner
 - Need to determine which information to provide
 - Depending on intended uses of the data
 - · For informality, the uses are very different
 - So, it is not easy to decide which information to provide
- Various international initiatives
 - That try to standardize the way metadata are to be organised and transmitted
 - Data Documentation Initiative (DDI)
 - ISO/IEC 11179
 - Standard of Data and Metadata Exchange (SDMX)
 - Data and Metadata Reporting and Presentation Handbook

- Paper reports
 - Advance release
 - Methodological report
 - Detailed survey report
- Computer-based products
 - Internet
 - Compact Disks
 - Micro-data (anonymised)
- Promotional efforts
 - Press releases
 - Brochures for the general public
 - Organized conferences
 - Articles for newspapers, magazines, professional journals


