Statistical Analysis of Disaggregated SDG Indicators for Inclusive Development Policies [3 June—12 July 2019] Chiba, Japan | in collaboration with JICA



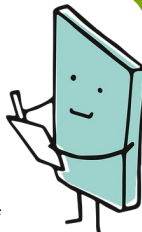
Twenty one statisticians in the governments in the Asian and Pacific region as well as of Africa from Twenty countries: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Egypt, Ghana, Indonesia, Iraq, Kenya, Lao P.D.R Malawi, Mali, Mongolia, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, Solomon Islands, Sudan, Thailand Tunisia, Vanuatu and Viet Nam are participating in the course.

The six-week training program is to strengthen capacity to produce SDG indicators and relevant economic, social, and environment statistics that facilitate the analysis of disparities for formulated of inclusive development policies and programs.

Country Reports were presented by the participants, bringing out geographical features of their countries, major government institutions, official statistical system in the country and status of compilations of SDG indicators. The course has so far taken up discussion on Sustainable Development Goal global indicator frame work; Data and Statistics needed for compilation of these indicators; Concepts and measurement of inclusive development, policy analysis based on the SDG indicator related data, especially after its disaggregation; and hands-on exercises on sampling designs, linear models; small area estimation techniques. In upcoming weeks, the participants will work on their projects on measurement of disparities in development outcomes on a few SDG indicators using their country data.

Internship Programme

SIAP has been providing an internship programme that exposes young graduate and postgraduate students to the work of the United Nations in the area of statistics since 2017. This year, we have enrolled 9 students for the Internship programme. Period of internship ranges from a minimum of two months to a maximum of six months. As part of SIAP team, they work directly with professional staff members and senior management, and assist in conduct of training programme.



e-Learning Course on Official Statistics for SDGs [1 May to 14 June 2019 | Online]

This course provided fundamental knowledge on official statistics and also help to understand how Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) indicators are compiled from official statistics. One hundred and ninety-nine participants from twenty-six countries successfully completed the programme.

Gender Mainstreaming Policies for Government Officers [17 to 18 June 2019 | Chiba, Japan | in collaboration with JICA]



The course aimed at enhancing capability of the national machinery to disseminate the perspective of gender mainstreaming and gender equality in the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of policies and plans in various field. Nine officers from six countries participated in the course.

Workshop of Quality on Statistics for Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) Indicators [13—15 May 2019 | Chiba, Japan]



The workshop provided an opportunity to participants to learn basic concepts and frameworks for the quality of statistics through hands-on sessions, with the overall aim of enhancing the capacity to produce a set of quality statistics including indicators, to especially monitor Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Seventeen participants from seventeen countries participated. The workshop was organized in collaboration with UN Statistics Division (UNSD) and International Monetary Fund (IMF).
