Rights of women in Constitution of Nepal 2015

- 1. Every woman shall have equal right without gender based discrimination.
- 2. Every woman shall have the right to safe motherhood and reproductive health.
- 3. No woman shall be subjected to physical, mental, sexual, psychological or other form of violence or exploitation on grounds of religion, social, cultural tradition, practice or on any other grounds. Such act shall be punishable by law, and the victim shall have the right to obtain compensation in accordance with law.
- 4. Women shall have the right to participate in all bodies of the State on the basis of the principle of proportional inclusion.
- 5. Women shall have the right to obtain special opportunity in-education, health, employment and social security, on the basis of positive discrimination.
- 6. The spouse shall have the equal right to property and family affairs.

Proposed Main Programs/Trainings of Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS) in 2018 - 2021

Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS) has plan to conduct training programs on following main activities,

- 1. Nepal Multi Indicator Cluster Survey (NMICS) in 2018/19
- 2. Nepal Living Standards Survey (NLSS IV) in 2018/19
- 3. Time Use Survey in 2020
- 4. National Population & Housing Census in 2021

Training is main part for the successful completion of field work for mentioned main statistical activities in year 2018 to 2021. These training programs (including gender statistics) will be conducted mainly for field staffs/enumerators & supervisors

Nepal Labour Force Survey III (NLFS)


Central Bureau of Statistics (CBS) has conducted NLFS III. The 12 month field work has just finished in last July 2018. The sample size of this NIFS was 900 PSUs (18000 HHs)


Many questions were asked relating to time used in different activities (main job, secondary job, business activities, family members serving household busyness activities etc) in this NLFS III.


The flow chart (some part/section, many questions of NLFS relating to time use is supposed to ask in proposed time use survey) of this survey is presented here.


Nepal Labour Force Survey (NLFS III) 2017/18

Working Time (All Jobs): Section E












Section I: Production of Goods for Household or Family use

For persons aged 5 years and above, activities performed in last 30 days









Section J: Own-use Production of Services

Time Use Survey

CBS has just finished the field work of NLFS III. Although so many questions (specially pay or profit, type of work related & some unpaid work also)are asked related to time use in this survey, But detail questions relating to individual's time use is not captured.

In the history of Nepal, first time, CBS is going to conduct Time Use Survey proposed in 2019/20. Some features of time use survey are stated below; Time use survey,

- Gives the information about how, how much and in which activities we spend our time.
- Contribution to the national economy by gender
- Analyze issues of gender equality
- Helps to inform the issues of well being by gender

Time-allocation patterns

Differences between women and men in time-allocation patterns

- Types of activities and
- Their schedule during a specified period of time

Reflecting differences in roles and expectations with regard to

- Family and domestic life
- Participation in work and
- Participation in social activities outside the home.

Gender differences extend beyond the distribution of roles in paid and unpaid work.

• Different patterns of leisure activities

Unpaid work

- Estimating the participation of women and men in unpaid work and the value of this unpaid work for the economy.
- Women, more often than men, tend to be involved and spend a great amount of time in unpaid work in the home and community.
- Some types of unpaid work are **not covered by conventional labour statistics** or the System of National Accounts.

Examples: cleaning dwellings, performing small repairs, preparing and serving meals, caring for and instructing children, caring for other persons in the household and certain types of volunteer community services.

• Estimating household production in satellite accounts that extend measurement GDP.

Participation in all forms of Work:

- Improve estimates of employment and labour force participation
 - Activities that are within the general production boundary of the SNA.
- Production of goods for own consumption:
 - Example: agricultural work, fishing, hunting, cutting firewood, carrying water, threshing and milling grain, making butter and cheese and slaughtering livestock.
- Bias in data collection leads underreported in labour force surveys or censuses.
 - Women in particular tend to have their participation underreported
- Time-use surveys are more suited for capturing the involvement of women and men in atypical cases of non-market activities

Intrahousehold inequality

- Time as a resource distributed between family members
- Intrahousehold division of labour and decision making
- Changes in allocation of time within the household with access to public services, infrastructure or technology.
- Changes in employment, schooling and learning outcomes with changes in allocation of time within the household

Time use information/data helps to understand

- What individuals do
- The activities they engage in and
- How much time is spent doing each activity.

Revel activities which are not well captured in other statistical system

- All forms of work (market and non-market) including Household production/subsistence work
- Unpaid domestic work
- Leisure/personal care

Inform policies

- Public services/infrastructure provisions
- Measure impact of development interventions
- Employment generation
- Welfare promotion
- Promote shared household responsibilities

Type of survey instrument

1.Time diaries: ask respondents to describe all of the activities performed over a specified time period,

a.Full time dairies

24-hour Diary with Open Time Intervals 24-hour Diary with Fixed Time Intervals

b. Light time dairies

Pre-Coded or "Light" Time Diary (supposed to use Nepal time use survey)

2. Stylized analog to diaries: short and comprehensive listing of each activities.

Issues to consider (time use survey)

- The method of data collection
- The classification of activities covered
- The recording of contextual information
- The recording of simultaneous activities
- The coverage of relevant individual and household characteristics
- The sample design
