


Report from the Subgroup on Gender Statistics Training

SGGST: Report of activities in 2020

- Subgroup on Gender Statistics training: Tasked with
 - Generating a repository of training experts on this topic
 - Generating a training curriculum on gender statistics
 - Promote the implementation of training on gender statistics across the region
 - Promote the quality of training on gender statistics across the region
- SGGST's work in 2021:
 - Training curriculum is available on-line since 2020

 - Materials were converted into e-learning to ensure virtual access at participant's own pace
 - Virtual TOT was organized with SIAP and ESCAP
 - E-learning materials were tested and used for TOT

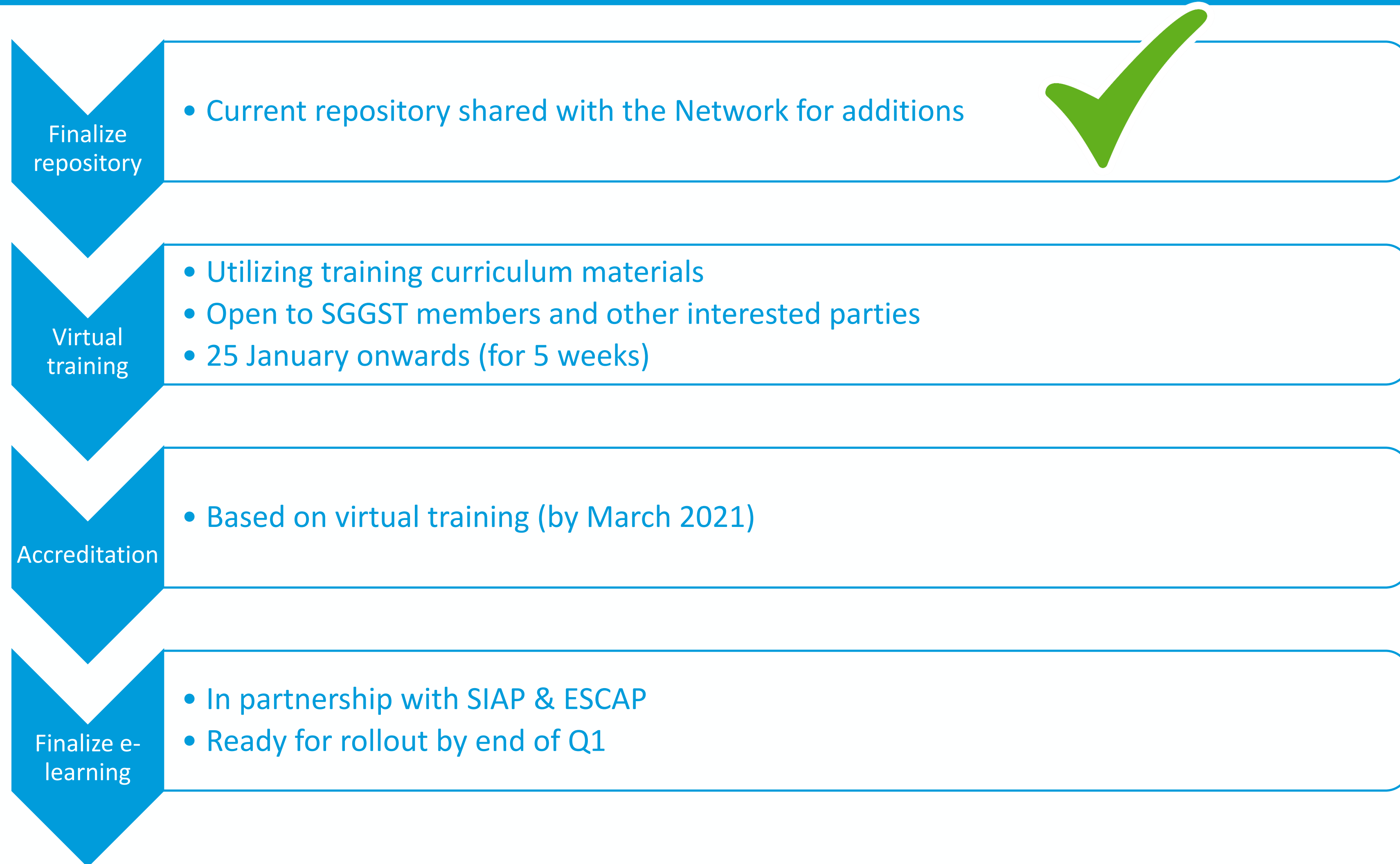

2020

- HKBU designed a course on gender statistics and storytelling, to be rolled out starting January 2021
- School of data in Kyrgyzstan is currently translating the materials to organize a course on gender statistics and the media, to be launched in January 2021
- National University of Mongolia developed a course on Gender and Economics (post-grad) for implementation on February onwards.
- BPS Indonesia is collaborating with the Ministry of Women and NGOs to organize a webinar series on gender statistics training
- SESRIC is planning a training on gender and population statistics that will utilize the training curriculum, to be delivered in Q1 2021
- PRSTI conducted training (with Paris 21) for local government, on the importance of gender statistics.
- Rep. Korea expressed interest in translating the materials to implement related training.

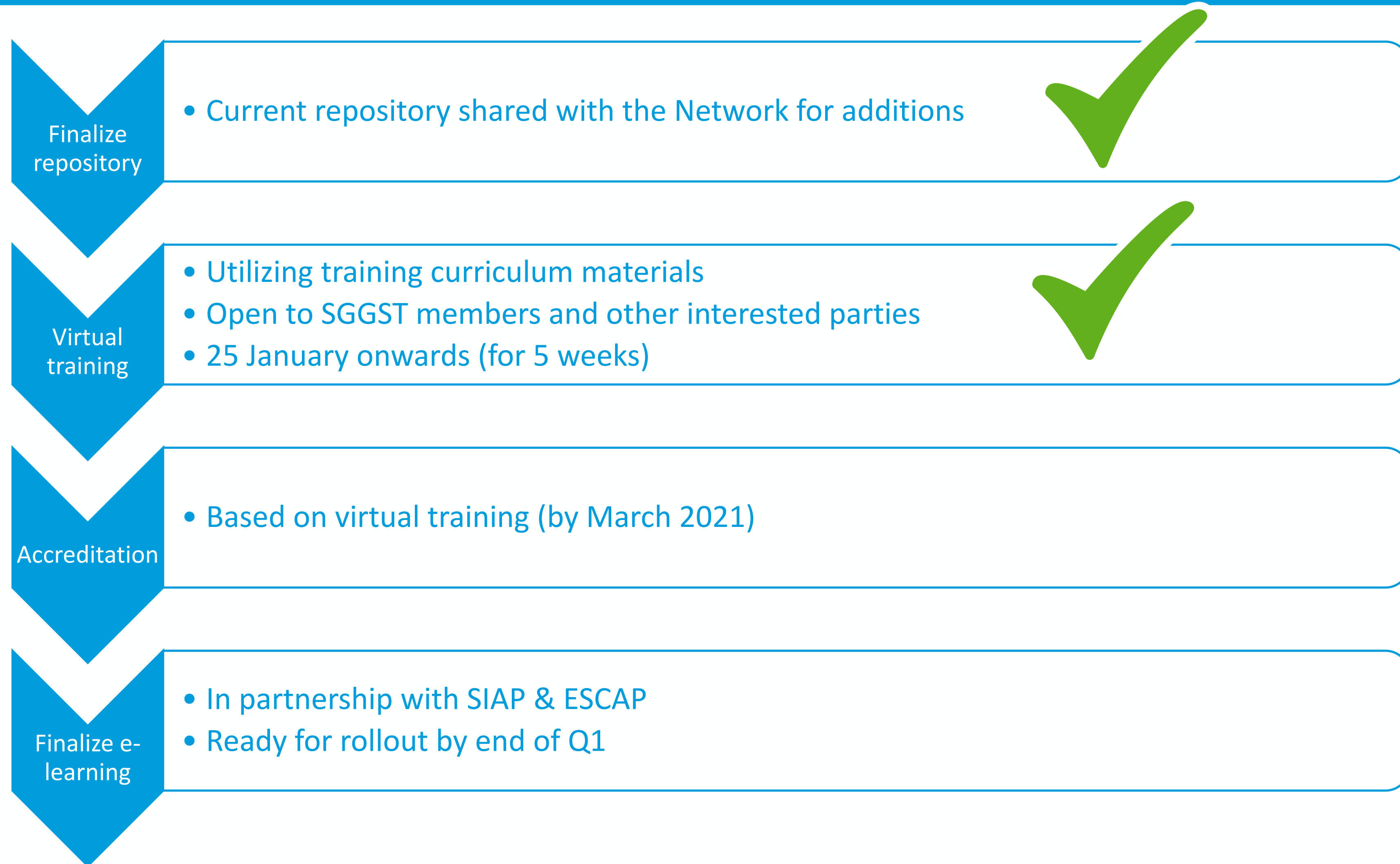
Repository of experts

Priority activities for 2021



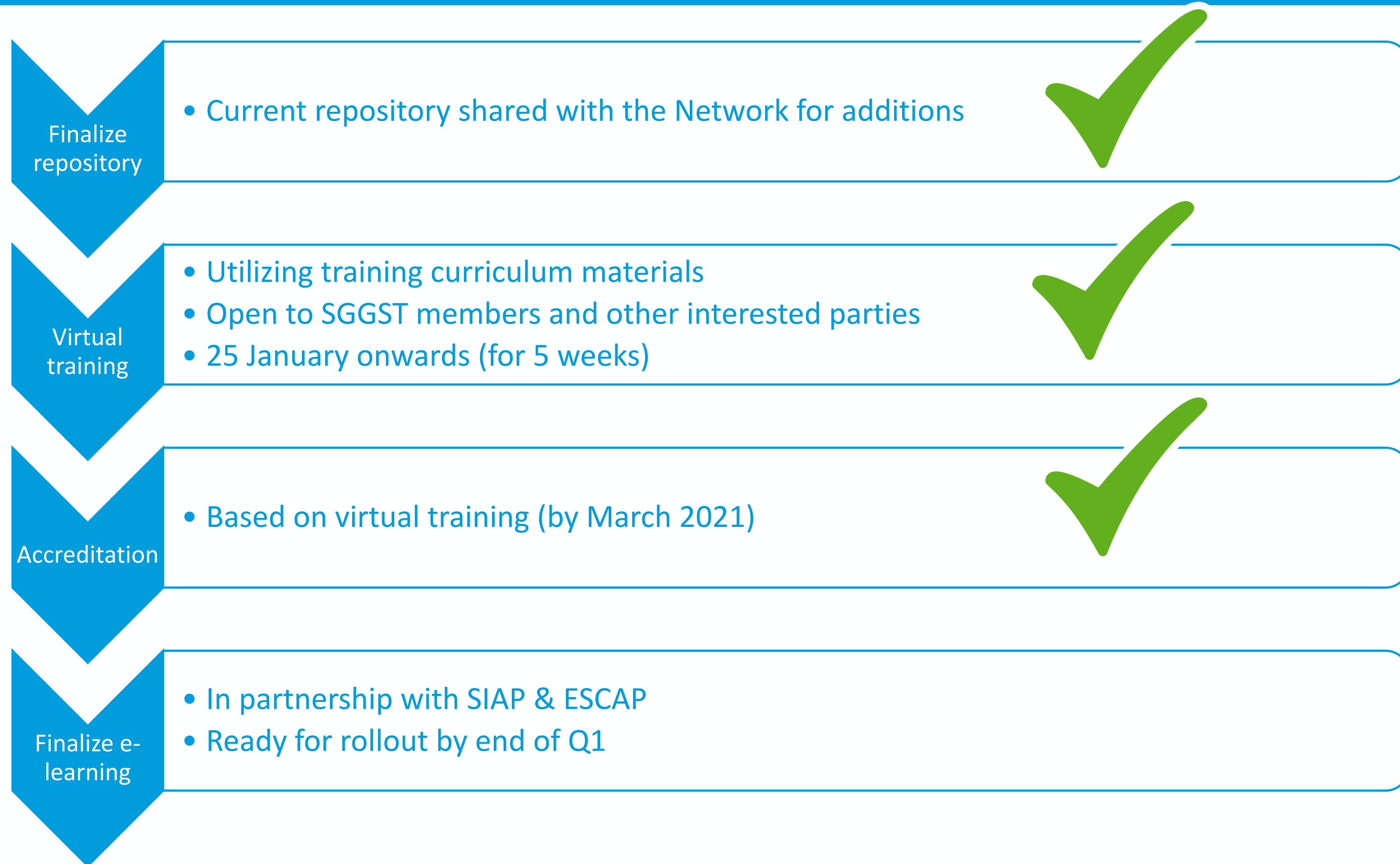
Virtual Training of Trainers

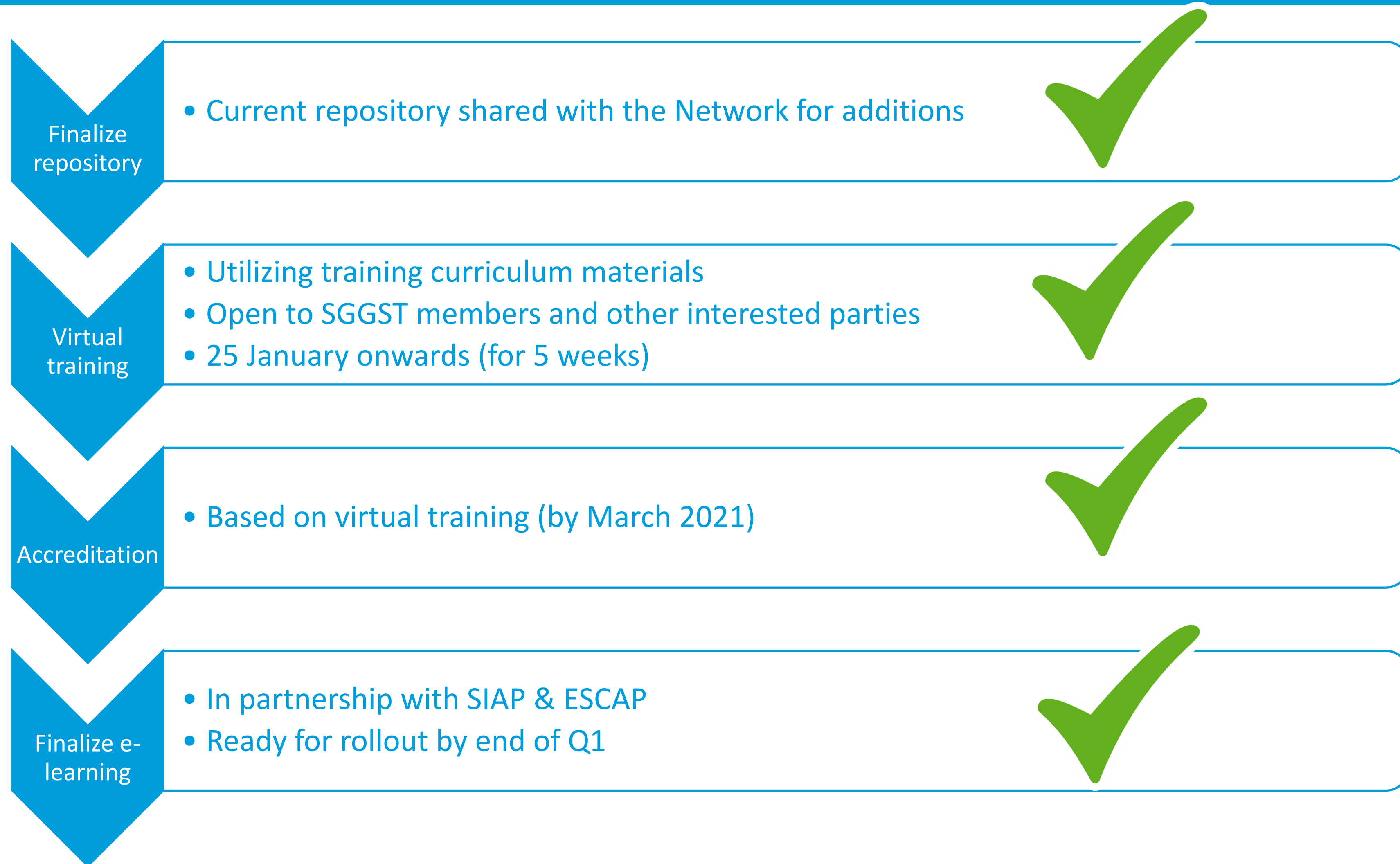


Accreditation and standardization of the training curriculum

- As discussed during previous Network meeting, a system of accreditation is being explored
- Each of the training modules includes a final test, only accessible by trainers
- Accreditation system tested during virtual training (2021) upon
 - Attendance
 - Successful completion of final test
- Different accreditation certificate for face-to-face training (to be explored)
- Accredited participants added to repository of experts



Priority activities for 2021

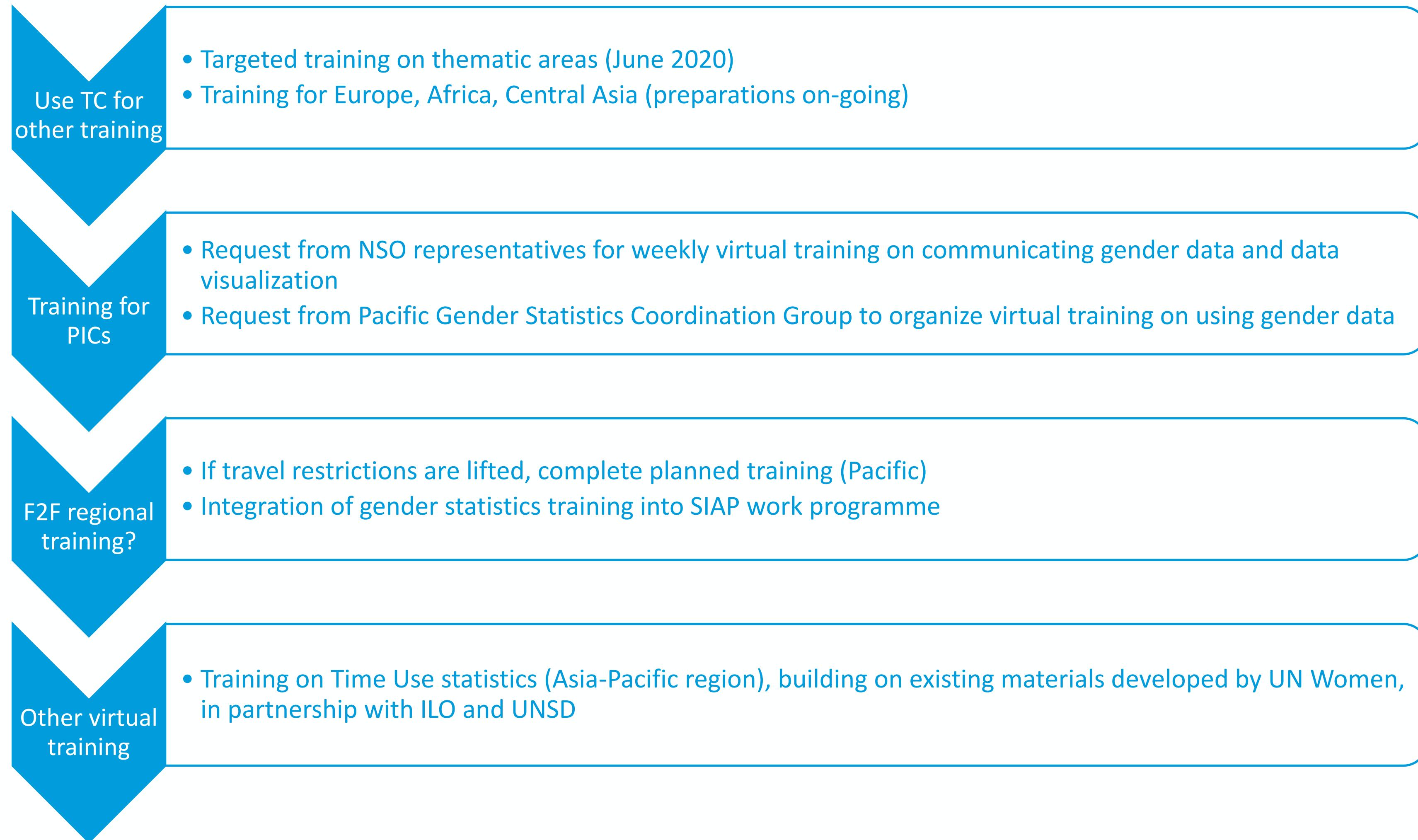


E-learning

- Focus on data use (analysis, communication, dialogue, etc)
- Utilizes Training curriculum materials
- Additional materials to complement TC provided by SIAP & ESCAP (e.g. how to organize training)
- E-learning tested during TOT (modules made available to participants in advance)
- Feedback received and modules being edited before making available to broader audience
